## An Extraordinarily Rare German New Guinea Note

This German colony was invaded by Australian forces at the beginning of World War I. The only significant engagement took place on September 11, 1914 near Rabaul as the Germans and their native forces were defeated by the Australians. These provisional notes were issued at Rabaul and circulated for only two months before being recalled and exchanged for the Australian Pound.
